I've been meaning to write you for some time to thank you for the copy of your book '25 Years Phonological Comments' which you sent me. There are a number of things in it that I've enjoyed reading.

I'm presently spending (almost) two years here in Geneva and one of the things I'm doing in the city of de Saussure, naturally, is writing a history book - devoted to the particular topic of the balance between 'rules' and 'representations' in 20th century phonology. I've gotten about half of it done, and am having some copies made at UCLA - when they're ready, one will be sent to you. Of course, I'd be very happy to have any comments on it.

The enclosed appeared a while ago, but as it really represents an expansion of remarks I made at the Copenhagen Congress, I thought you might be interested in it if you

I'm not sure I'll be at the Phonetics Congress next summer in Utrecht - Contrary to the Copenhagen one (and most others) there's virtually no place on the program for phonology, and my interest in the sort of things they do seem to have in mind is limited. I hope future Congresses reverse this apparent anti-phonological trend - I've been meaning to write to Marcel van der Broeke (the only person on the organizing committee that I know) but never got around to it, as usual...

I hope I'll be able to come to Copenhagen some time while I'm in Europe. In any event, best wishes for the season and for the coming year.
