If, however, I consider it my duty, as editor, to run an extra chick on the logical structure of the theory (not least, I will add, because of Chomsky's gratuitous sneer about 'grammaticists' having a reputation for logically feeble reason that escaped him), addition of the Shatz to the Résumé would, in my opinion, have naturally led to alterations in the text which — even if permitted by the ground-rules imposed — I would presumably have been required to justify by notes that would have drawn a disproportionately amount of attention to the essentially minor flaws involved. Just how minor they are, is, I believe, shown without further ado in the Shatz, which I shall be happy to make available to anyone interested. (Feel free, by the way, to let anything Xerox your copy when you see fit to do so.)

I am well aware that the whole thing may well appear, at the moment and perhaps for a long time to come, to have been a quixotic undertaking. So long as the quest continues for anchors in some supposed universal function of expression purpose or content purpose or both, the Résumé is, I suppose, unlikely to find many readers willing to undertake the hard job of following and testing its arguments. Perhaps only Cercioli, Haes, and a few others will concern it worth the trouble. But that does not in the least diminish my satisfaction over having been able to make it available for study when its time comes.
