Dear Tom,

I enclose an 'Alphabetic Register of Definitions', to be added to the manuscript of the Prolegomena, immediately preceding the 'Definitions'. The Register will be most useful if it is set in small enough type so that it will occupy one page. I suggest three columns of 36 entries each (analysis-form, function-permutation, procedure-word).

In the manuscript, in the table of contents, before 'Definitions', should be added 'Alphabetic register of Definitions'. On page 3, line 5 from bottom, 'Louis Hjelmslev's study' should be changed to 'the author's study'.

These are all the changes that Hjelmslev and I would wish to make in the manuscript submitted. We have considered carefully Rulon Wells' suggestions, and we are most grateful for his careful reading and report. If we have not accepted them all, it is for considerations that probably did not, or could not, occur to him when he made them.

Hjelmslev expects to hear from you about the agreement, and I have informed him that he should feel free to negotiate the whole matter independently with you. Anything acceptable to him will be all right with me. A better address for him than the one I have given you is:
