In matter of language, as opposed to speech, the first aim should be to establish the structure of the system of all words of the given langage, i.e. the structure of the system of word classes, with its subdivisions. Compare my paper STRUCTURAL LINGUISTICS AND WORD CLASSES, in Lingua 1,427-500 (1948), esp.468- 472 and 484-487.
